FSU WHEN TRAILING AT HALF

- » Prior to today's loss, Florida State had won seven consecutive regular season games when trailing at halftime, including each of the past two seasons against Louisville.
- » In the season opener against Ole Miss, the Seminoles trailed 28-13 at the break before posting a 45-34 win over the No. 11 Rebels.
- » In 2014 at Louisville, the Cardinals held a 21-7 lead at the break before FSU won, 42-31. In 2015, Louisville led 7-6 at the break before FSU won, 41-21.
- » Before today, the last regular season loss for FSU when the Noles trailed at halftime was a 37-26 (13-3 at half) loss against Florida in 2012.

NOLES OPEN SEASON SCORING IN TEN STRAIGHT QUARTERS

- » Entering Week 3, Florida State was one of 19 teams in the country to score in every quarter in 2016.
- » With Ricky Aguayo's 47-yard field goal in the first quarter and Auden Tate's 20-yard touchdown in the second, the Noles streak to open the season extended to 10 straight quarters scoring points.
- » The streak ended when the Noles failed to score in the third quarter.

AGUAYO HITS CAREER-LONG FIELD GOAL

- » True freshman kicker Ricky Aguayo opened the Florida State scoring with a 47-yard field goal with 1:41 left in the first quarter.
- » The 47-yard field goal was the longest of his young career, topping a 46-yarder against Charleston Southern last week.
- » On the season, Aguayo is 9-of-10 on field goals and 12-12 on extra points.

PUGH PICKS UP SOLO SACK IN FIRST HALF

- » Junior Jacob Pugh picked up his first solo sack of the season with a nine-yard sack against Lamar Jackson early in the second quarter.
- » He is third on the team with 1.5 sacks on the season after teaming with DeMarcus Walker for a sack in the season opener.
- » The drive ended on a missed field goal off the left upright.

PATRICK, TATE CAREER-LONGS SPARK SECOND QUARTER SCORE

- » Sophomore running back Jacques Patrick took a handoff 41 yards on his first touch of the game.
- » The run was a career-long (previous was 28 yards against Syracuse in 2015) and ended with Auden Tate's 20-yard touchdown catch to make the score 14-10 Louisville.
- » Tate's 20-yard touchdown was the longest catch of his career and his second career touchdown after getting his first last week against Charleston Southern.
- » Tate added another TD and registered his first-ever multi-TD game with a fourth quarter TD from J.J. Cosentino.

McFADDEN RECORDS SECOND CAREER INTERCEPTION

- » Sophomore defensive back Tarvarus McFadden picked off Lamar Jackson with 3:02 remaining the third quarter.
- » It was McFadden's second career interception and second of the season after intercepting Chad Kelly in the season opener against Ole Miss.
- » Lamarcus Brutus (3) was the only Seminole with multiple interceptions in 2015.

FIRST HALF

- » Redshirt junior linebacker Matthew Thomas had eight first-half tackles and finished the game with XX. His career high entering Saturday was seven against Ole Miss in the season opener. Junior Jacob Pugh also set a career high with X tackles.

GAME CAPTAINS

- » Florida State's captains against Louisville are seniors DeMarcus Walker, Sean Maguire, Nate Andrews and Freddie Stevenson.
- » Florida State won the toss and deferred to the second half.
