FLORIDA STATE CAPS OFF 20-WIN SEASON IN SECOND ROUND OF NIT BACON AND BEASLEY EARN FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICAN HONORS

BOOKERT ENDS CAREER AMONG SEMINOLE LEADERS IN 3-POINT SHOOTING

FLORIDA STATE'S 2015-16 SEASON IN REVIEW

Florida State finished the 2015-16 season with a 20-14 overall record, an 8-10 mark in ACC play, advanced to the second round of the NIT, finished in fourth place at the Paradise Jam with wins over DePaul (83-67, Nov. 21) and Ohio (90-81, Nov. 23), defeated Florida Atlantic in the Orange Bowl Classic (64-59, Dec. 19) and won at Florida (73-71, Dec. 29) in finishing with a 10-2 non-conference record. The Seminoles earned two victories over nationally ranked teams with wins over No. 11 Virginia (69-62 on Jan. 17) and against then No. 20 Notre Dame (77-56 on Feb. 27) and totaled four wins over teams selected to play in the NCAA Tournament (Virginia, Notre Dame, Syracuse and VCU). Florida State played nine teams that were selected to play in the NCAA Tournament and faced four teams (Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech, Florida and Hofstra) that played in the NIT.

BACON NAMED OFFENSIVE MVP; BOOKERT EARNS DEFENSIVE MVP HONORS

Freshman Dwayne Bacon, who earned Freshman All-America and All-ACC Freshman team honors, earned four trophies including the coveted Dave Cowens Chairman of the Boards and Bob Sura Outstanding Offensive awards at the Seminoles' Honors Banquet on April 10, 2016. Bacon averaged a team-leading 15.8 points and a team leading 5.8 rebounds in becoming the first freshman in school history to lead the Seminoles in scoring and rebounding. Bookert was honored along with his senior teammates – Boris Bojanovsky, Montay Brandon, Michael Ojo and Michael Saxton for their accomplishments during the 2015-16 season and their four-year careers. Bookert was presented with the Charlie Ward Outstanding Defensive Player Award as he finished third in the ACC with a career-high 1.7 steals per game average.

BACON AND BEASLEY EARN FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICAN HONORS

Dwayne Bacon and Malik Beasley, the Seminoles' top two scorers during the 2015-16 season, were both named to the 2016 Kyle Macy Freshman All-American Team presented by collegeinsider.com. Bacon (15.8 ppg) and Beasley (15.6 ppg) enjoyed two of the most productive seasons in school history as they led the Seminoles to a 20-14 record and into the second round of the NIT. Bacon and Beasley, who were both named to the All-ACC Freshman team, where one of only three sets of teammates named to the 30-member squad. They were two of five ACC freshmen (Bryant Crawford of Wake Forest, Brandon Ingram of Duke, Malachi Richardson of Syracuse) included on the list and were two of the three freshmen who finished the season ranked among the ACC's top 20 overall scorers. Bacon was named the ACC Rookie of the Week a school-record five times this season. He finished his first collegiate season ranked 13th overall (and second among freshmen) in scoring and 20th overall (and third among freshmen) in rebounding making him one of only two freshmen in the ACC who ranked in the top 20 in the conference in scoring and rebounding.

BACON AND BEASLEY NAMED TO ALL-ACC FRESHMAN TEAM

Dwayne Bacon and Malik Beasley, two of the top first-year players in Florida State history, were named to the 2016 All-ACC Freshman team by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association. It marked the first time in school history multiple Seminoles have been named to the All-ACC Freshman team while their selections to the team mark the eighth and ninth players in school history to earn All-ACC Freshman team honors. Bacon (15.8 ppg and 5.8 rpg) and Beasley (15.7 ppg and 5.3 rpg) rank as the top freshmen scoring duo in school history and are the third highest scoring freshmen duo in ACC history with a combined scoring average of 31.5 points per game. Bacon has scored on double figures in 27 of 30 games with his career high of 27 points coming against Jacksonville on Nov. 17 while Beasley scored in double figures in the first 24 games of his career and in 26 games this season.

BRANDON SETS SCHOOL RECORD OR CAREER STARTS

Montay Brandon, who played on three postseason tournament teams and ranks among Florida State's all-time top-25 in four different categories closed his career at the Seminoles' all-time leader with 122 career games started. In addition to finishing as the all-time leader in games-started, he finished his career ranked fourth in school history with 135 career games played, ranked 16th in school history with 409 career free throws attempted and ranked 22nd in school history with 252 career free throws made. Brandon played in 135 of 137 games during his career and is the only player in school history to start 120 or more games as a Seminole.

BEASLEY BECOMES FLORIDA STATE'S 11TH NBA FIRST ROUND DRAFT PICK

Freshman Malik Beasley was selected with the 19th pick in the first round of the 2016 NBA Draft. He is the 11th first round NBA Draft Choice in school history and the fourth Seminole taken in the first round of the NBA Draft under head coach Leonard Hamilton. Beasley became the first Seminole chosen in the first round of the NBA Draft since Chris Singleton was selected 18th overall by the Washington Wizards in 2011 and is the first Florida State player selected in the draft since the Cleveland Cavaliers selected Bernard James in the second round of the 2012 NBA Draft. As one of 15 players invited by NBA officials to attend the draft at the Barclays Center, Beasley became the first one and done player – he played only one season at Florida State – in school history. In being taken with the 19th pick overall, Beasley is just the seventh player in school history to be taken within the first 20 picks of the NBA Draft. Beasley's pick is the seventh highest in school history.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE NBA DRAFT

The Seminoles are fourth in the ACC in the last 13 seasons with 10 overall draft selections. Only North Carolina with 21 overall selections (including Brice Johnson and Marcus Paige in 2016), Duke with 20 selections (including Brandon Ingram in 2016) and Syracuse with 16 selections (including Malachi Richardson and Michael Gbinije in 2016) have had more players taken in the NBA Draft than Florida State since Tim Pickett was taken in the second round by the New Orleans Hornets in 2004.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 11 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 11 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 233 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15) and 20-14 (2015-16).

LEONARD HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME ACC COACHING GREATS

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton, the ACC Coach of the Year in 2009 and 2012, is the winningest coach in school history, is the 10th winningest all-time coach in ACC history (with 256 all-time victories at Florida State), is the 11th all-time winningest coach for career ACC victories (ACC regular season and ACC Tournament) with 115 and is the ninth all-time winningest ACC road game coach in ACC history (38). Hamilton needs nine overall wins to surpass Frank McGuire of North and South Carolina who won 264 career games; needs only three victories to surpass Norm Sloan of NC State with 117 career ACC wins and needs only five ACC road wins to surpass Lefty Driesell of Maryland who won 42 career ACC road games.

HAMILTON'S CONTRACT EXTENDED

Florida State University Director of Athletics Stan Wilcox announced on Feb. 28, 2016 that Florida State has reached an agreement in principle with head basketball coach Leonard Hamilton on an extension of his contract. The Seminoles' leader in all-time wins, Hamilton's current contract will be extended through the 2018-19 season. "Our goal is to be in the NCAA Tournament annually," said Wilcox. "Leonard has led this program admirably since 2002. This extension positions him to continue attracting the kind of talent we need to compete in the ACC and nationally."

FLORIDA STATE'S CAPTAINS

Head Coach Leonard Hamilton named Devon Bookert Florida State's captain and named Boris Bojanovsky and Michael Ojo as the Seminoles' co-captains.

BACON NAMED TO ALL-ACC ACADEMIC TEAM

Florida State's Dwayne Bacon, who was named the ACC Rookie of the Week a school-record five times during the 2015-16 season, was named to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Men's Basketball Team. To be eligible for consideration, a student-athlete must have earned a 3.0 grade point average for the previous semester and maintained a 3.0 cumulative average during his academic career. Bacon was one of 10 ACC freshmen named to the 26-member All-ACC Academic team and is one of seven All-ACC academic honorees averaged in double figures during the 2015-16 season.

SEMINOLES IN THE POSTSEASON

Florida State advanced to the second round of the NIT marking the 11th time under Leonard Hamilton the Seminoles' advanced to play in the postseason. The Seminoles have made four NCAA appearances and seven NIT appearances under Hamilton since the 2003-04 season.

SEMINOLES IN THE ACC STATISTICS

Florida State, which earned four of its eight ACC wins by double digits, finished third in the ACC in scoring with a 78.0 points scored per game average. It marked the first time the Seminoles averaged 77 or more points per game since the 1992-93 season when they averaged 86.3 points per game in advancing to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament.

SEMINOLES WITH TWO VICTORIES OVER RANKED TEAMS

Florida State defeated No. 1 Virginia (69-62, Jan. 17, 2016) and No. 20 Notre Dame (77-56, Feb. 27, 2016) to mark the 31st and 32nd victories over nationally ranked teams under Leonard Hamilton since the start of the 2002-03 season. The Seminoles' victory over Virginia marked the Cavaliers largest margin in defeat during the regular season and their win over the Fighting Irish was their largest margin in defeat during the entire season. Florida State's +21-point victory over Notre Dame was its largest over a ranked team since it defeated then No. 3 North Carolina by a 90-57 margin (+33 points) on Jan. 14, 2012.

Florida State made its season high of 11 3-point shots in its victory over No. 20 Notre Dame on Feb. 27 in Tallahassee and has made 18 3-point shots in its final two home games of the regular season (victories over Notre Dame and Syracuse). Florida State made at least 10 3-point shots in five different games during the 2015-16 season and were 4-1 in those games. Florida State made 220 3-point field goals – the fourth highest single season total in school history and the most since the Seminoles made 234 during the 2007-08 season. Florida State's 11 3-point field goals made in its victory over Notre Dame on Feb. 27, 2016 was its most 3-point shots made in an ACC game since making a school record for ACC games 16 in a victory over Maryland on Jan. 12, 2014.

Florida State, which earned its ACC season high of 13 steals against Louisville on Jan. 20, finished the 2015-16 season ranked third in the ACC with a 7.1 steals per game average for the season. The Seminoles 243 steals for the season marks the 13th season in Leonard Hamilton's 14-year tenure that the Seminoles would have earned 200 or more steals in a single season. Florida State closed out the regular season with 10 steals against Syracuse – the fourth time it earned at least 10 steals in an ACC game. The Seminoles averaged 10.0 steals in two games against Syracuse and totaled eight in their victory over Boston College on Jan. 26.

BACON AND BEASLEY BECOME FIRST FLORIDA STATE FRESHMEN TO REACH 500 POINTS

Freshman phenom Dwayne Bacon (536 points / 15.8 ppg) and freshman sensation Malik Beasley (529 points / 15.6 ppg) finished the 2015-16 season as the two highest scoring freshmen in school history and as the first two freshmen in school to score 500 or more points in a season. Both players were named to the All-ACC Freshman Team by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association and the ACC's 15 head coaches and Beasley earned All-ACC Honorable Mention All-ACC honors in a vote of the league's coaches. Bacon (five times) and Beasley (three times) combined to win the ACC Rookie of the Week award eight times this season. BACON HITS GAME-WINNER AGAINST FLORIDA

Freshman phenom Dwayne Bacon scored the game-winning basket for the Seminoles' with 4.6 seconds remaining in their 73-71 win over Florida in Gainesville on Dec. 29.

BEASLEY REACHES 50 3-POINT SHOTS

Freshman sensation Malik Beasley made a Seminole-freshmen record 55 3-point shots as he became the first freshman in school history to make 50 or more 3-point shots. He reached the plateau in spectacular fashion in Florida State's 78-73 victory Syracuse (March 5) in the regular season finale for both teams. He made three consecutive 3-point shots during a 1:20 span that saw Florida State begin the second half at a 35-31 disadvantage and hold a two-point lead when Beasley's magic moment was done. It was Beasley's 3-pointer with 18:16 left to play that gave the Seminoles a 40-38 lead – and though Syracuse would tie the game twice during the second half, the Seminoles never trailed after Beasley's trifecta. Beasley was three of five from the bonusphere against the Orange. He is the first freshman and the 27th player in school history to make 40 or more 3-point shots in a season.

RATHAN-MAYES RANKED SIXTH IN THE ACC IN ASSISTS

Sophomore Xavier Rathan-Mayes earned a single-season career-high 146 assists and finished his second season as a Seminole ranked sixth in the ACC in assists. His 146 assists (career-high 4.4 assists per game) are nine more than his team leading 137 assists (4.3 assists per game) during his freshman season. Rathan-Mayes had at least one assist in each of the 33 games he has played in this season and tied his career high with 11 assists against both Nichols State (Nov. 15) in the Seminoles' season-opener and in the Seminoles' victory over Southeastern Louisiana (Dec. 13).

RATHAN-MAYES CLIMBING THE 30-POINTS SCORED GAME LADDER

Sophomore Xavier Rathan-Mayes scored 30 points against North Carolina on Jan. 4, 2016 to mark the fourth time in his career that he had scored at least 30 points in a single game. His career high of 35 points has come against both North Carolina (January 24, 2015) and Miami (Feb. 25, 2015) while 30 points also came against Clemson in the second round of the ACC Tournament (March 11, 2015). Rathan-Mayes became the first freshman in ACC history to score 30 or more points at least three times as a freshman and added his fourth career 30-point game against the Tar Heels earlier this week.

ST THOMAS, Virgin Islands – Florida State jumped out to a quick 16-4 lead and made 15 of 16 free throws in the final 5:54 to defeat Ohio 90-81 in the fourth place game at the Paradise Jam at the Sports and Fitness Center at the University of the Virgin Islands. The win gave Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton his 240th win at Florida State and moved him into a tie for 10th place for career wins in ACC history with former Wake Forest head coach Dave Odom. The Seminoles scored the first five points of the game on a lay-up by Malik Beasley and a 3-point shot by Dwayne Bacon, scored 15 of the first 17 points and led 16-4 on a Bacon free throw at the 15:15 mark before Ohio was able to get into any rhythm on offense.
